Re: **December 2019 - Borough Manager's Report**

Administration / Finance

- Insurance Claims & Matters:
 - Annual Safety Committee Certification renewed with the Commonwealth, workers compensation insurance discount received for 2020.
- Grant Projects (*Awards Since Last Meeting / New Activity – Grant Log Attached*)
 - Heart and Soul Community Planning Grant – site visit was held on 11/13 with officials who traveled from Philadelphia, Vermont and other areas around the state to meet with us and hear our proposal. We'll know by the end of December if we are awarded or not.
 - Attorney General's Community Drug Prevention Grant Project – accomplishment report completed, and reimbursement request sent to AG.
 - Henning Street Playground Project – attended 2020 DCNR grant workshop on 11/19 in Pine Township. Also scheduled to meet with Representative Matzie on 12/9 to seek his assistance with the project.
- Merchant St. Streetscape Project:
 - Project Update:
 - Baiano Contract – all punch list work completed and inspected. Final invoice received and on the Agenda for consideration.
 - Youngblood Paving Contract – punch list work still outstanding before contract can be closed out.
- Participated in the Downtown Development Committee Meeting on November 12, group working on 2020 goals to attract and retain businesses.
- Old Economy / Ambridge Bicentennial in 2024 – led Community Collaboration Sub-Committee Meeting on 11/20. Bicentennial effort is growing community support and participation. Steering Committee to meet on 12/5.
- Right to Know Requests – responded to three Right to Know requests: 1) a very large request for 17 separate records relative to police operations, 2) October Building Permit logs, and 3) copies of firefighters CBA and Police Chief correspondence.
- Troop Banner Program – program continues and processing many requests. Currently at 154 banners purchased as of 12/4/19. Final contribution for 2019 to the Veteran's Office is included on the bill list for consideration.
- 2019 Budget to Actual –General Fund performing well to-date, as of 11/27 – Revenue is at 95.6% / Expenditures are at 91.4%
- 2020 Budget – proposed budget advertised and posted on the Borough website, Facebook page, hallway bulletin board and at the Laughlin Library. No inquiries or questions received.
- Safety Committee Meeting – attended meeting on 12/4, meeting minutes in Council packet.

- Drafted December Coffee Talk article for Chamber of Commerce newsletter, attached.
- Advisory and Authority Boards – expiring terms, current office holders notified to reapply, and an advertisement ran in the Beaver County Times on 11/22 and posted on the Borough website.
- Electrical Distribution Contract for Borough Facilities, Streetlights, Traffic Signals, etc. – shopping around renewal quotes for upcoming 2021 renewal.
- Pension Plans:
 - Annual Act 44 Disclosure Statements provided to vendors.
 - Third Quarter Investments – funds performed well, modest gains – reports attached.
 - Defined Contribution Plan – retroactive contributions calculated and on the bill list for consideration.

Code Enforcement / Planning

- Multiple zoning-related permits issued – separate report included within the monthly code report highlighting the activity.
- Commercial Demolition:
 - 439-441 Merchant Street: contract awarded to lowest bidder, waiting on County to proceed with demolition project.
 - 418-420 Merchant Street: emergency demolition, met with County officials to rededicate funding from 6th and Melrose Building to this structure. Secured consent from the property owner, now working with the County to secure SHPO and DEP clearances.
- Residential Demolitions: Finalizing court order needed for 1633 Church Street, Solicitor to be back in Common Pleas Court on 1/6/2020. Worked out an understanding with the County regarding 915 5th Street. County now has all three properties out to bid (1633 Church, 915 5th, 320 Duss).
- Zoning Hearing Board Hearings – November 13th, 5:30 (Jesky Garage on Glenwood) and 6:15 (Beemac Development) Represented the Borough at both hearings in my capacity as Zoning Officer.
- 3rd Quarter Building and Demo Permits provided to County Assessment.
- Building Inspector – received notice from NIRA that effective November 18th, they longer will provide UCC inspection services. They honored and retained a third-party inspector to finish up open projects. Solicited requests for proposals from other inspection agencies. Received five responses, met with them and recommend appointing MDIA as the Borough's Building Inspection firm.

Fire Department / Public Safety

- Police Towing Agreement – contract executed and in place with Fasmo Towing effective December 1st. Chief Romutis coordinated updating the County 9-1-1 Center and all officers of the change. They have already been used for an accident last weekend under the new agreement.
- Police Union Grievance received on 11/12/19 regarding an issue relative to overpayment in holiday and vacation pay. Will address the matter in Executive Session as part of Step 3 of the grievance procedure.

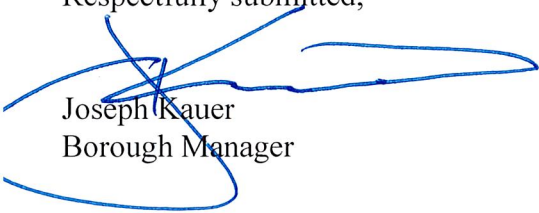
Public Works

News from Town Hall

December 2019

As 2019 is about to end, the Borough Council recently made available for public inspection the 2020 Budget. It's a balanced spending plan of \$5,016,966.61, that does not raise taxes or fees, excluding a minor \$3.13 per year increase in trash billing. This will be the 15th year without a Borough real estate tax increase. The budget can be reviewed at the office, library or at www.AmbridgeBoro.org Recapping 2019, there have been some accomplishments in Ambridge that as a community we can be proud of, they include: completion and dedication of the Merchant Street Streetscape Project between 4th and 8th Streets, replaced and upgraded the HVAC system for the Borough Building, completed road paving work on Merchant Street, Upper Alley and two municipal parking lots, received and placed a new fire squad vehicle and a new police cruiser into service, renegotiated and secured renewed Collective Bargaining Agreement with the Firefighters Union, received multiple accolades including Tree City USA Status, PA State Association of Borough's 1st Place Award for the Borough's Newsletter and 2nd Place for its Facebook page. The 2019 Budget Report also received a special recognition from PSAB. Created the Troop Banner Program that also donated close to \$2,000 to the Ambridge Veteran's Service Office, completed design work of the future Henning Street Playground and initiated fundraising for the project, and lastly, decorated Merchant Street within the Downtown for the Christmas holidays, a long-awaited desire of the community for the past eight years.

Also ending this year will be tenure of Councilman Duke McCoy and Councilwoman Janet Caldarelli. Mr. McCoy has served on Council for the past 16 years and Mrs. Caladrelli, the past 12 years. We thank them for their service, dedication and all the hard work they put in making Ambridge a better place. On January 6th, the Borough Council will reorganize and the newly elected members of Council including Jerome Gill and Tina Tessaro, along with re-elected Councilman Bob Dunn will be sworn into office.

On behalf of the Borough Council, Mayor Drewnowski and all the Borough staff, I wish you and yours a very Merry Christmas and the happiest of holidays. I look forward to welcoming 2020 as a year that will continue to bring about progress, growth and prosperity to our community.

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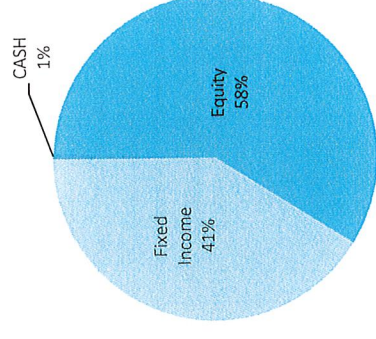
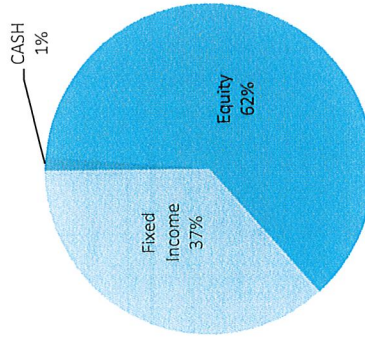

Mid-Quarter Commentary

November 2019

With the S&P 500 trading at an all-time high and returning over 4% quarter-to-date, risk assets have performed remarkably well. Much of this positive performance can be attributed to the progress being made on the trade front. With the hope of a “phase one” trade deal being signed with China before year-end, investors’ outlooks have gradually become more optimistic toward global growth over the medium term. In addition, further easing by the Federal Reserve has also been supportive of risk assets. The Federal Reserve cut the Fed Funds rate by an additional 25 bps during their October 30th meeting, bringing the aggregate amount of interest rate cuts to 75 bps since the beginning of 2019. Interest rates across the yield curve have been generally decreasing year-to-date, however; since the beginning of the fourth quarter interest rates have begun to rise as the overall growth outlook for both the U.S. and abroad has improved. Following this recent run-up in interest rates, the durations our portfolios are close to being neutral relative to the benchmark. We see the likelihood of a continued sell-off in bonds to be low, as it would require significantly stronger economic data as well as a reversal of the Fed’s current stance. We also believe that given the recent performance of equities and their full valuations, a neutral asset allocation relative to the benchmark is most appropriate.

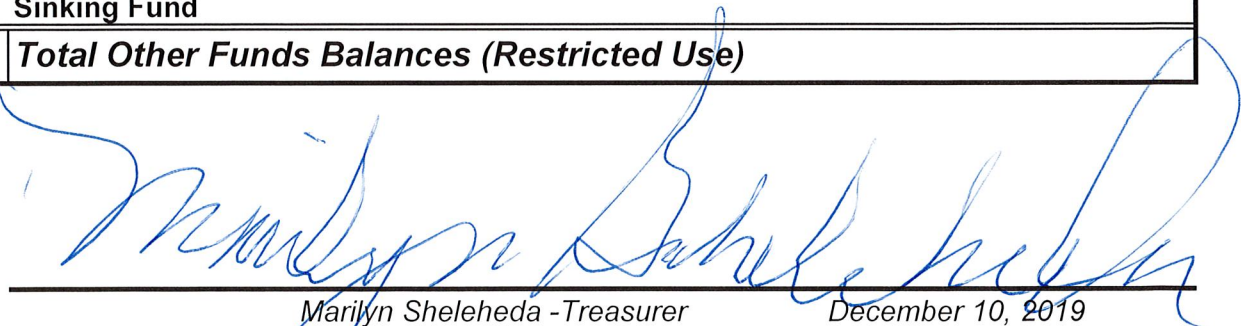

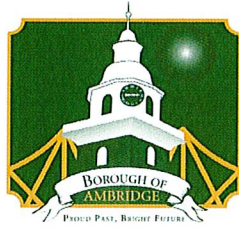
