### September Report

### Mayor and Council;

Attached you will find the monthly lists of all reports submitted by the Ambridge Police Department for the month of August, 2019. Addresses have been redacted to protect the privacy of victims and other reporting individuals. All reported crimes have been underlined and the asterisk represents a summary offense.

We continue 'Coffee with a Cop' monthly meeting with the public through the Chamber of Commerce. This month we are again meeting immediately after council session at the Laughlin Memorial Library in order to give working people a chance to meet, comment or ask questions.

Part-time Officer Austin Turner has resigned to accept a full time position at Carnegie-Mellon University.

Trained officers in truck enforcement are scheduled across the various shifts and several overweight truck citations have been issued, totaling \$9500.00 fines and costs.

During August, officers on the Daylight shift toured the high school to familiarize themselves with the layout in case of emergency response. We are still waiting for the school district to link police department computers with the school camera system.

School crossing guards underwent PENDOT's Safe Routes to School Training on 22 Aug in the fire dept. training room. New guards also practiced the practical skills.

Accompanying find the Automated License Plate Reader System Policy for approval in anticipation of camera deployment.

We request an internet link on the borough website for local Megan's Law registrants.

We will discuss the possibilities of applying for a COPS grant, car and body cameras and new communications equipment (portables and unit radios) at the next Public Safety meeting.

Only one drug raid occurred during the month, a repeat at 274 14<sup>th</sup> St. during which a small amount of crack cocaine was seized.

### 1.0 POLICY

1.1 It is the policy of this department to utilize Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) technology to capture and store digital license plate data and images for legitimate law enforcement purposes while respecting the established privacy rights of the public.

### 2.0 PURPOSE

- 2.1 This policy will provide officers with procedures that shall be followed for the capture, storage and use of digital data obtained using ALPR technology. Changes in law and procedure, as well as training provided on this procedure will give rise to modifications and updates.
- 2.2 Use of the ALPR system and access to all collected data and images shall be used for official law enforcement purposes only.
- 2.3 Captured data collected or retained using an ALPR system is not subject to disclosure under the act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law.

### 3.0 DEFINITIONS

- ALPR: Automated License Plate Reader aka License Plate Reader (LPR)
- FOUO: For Official Use Only
- OCR: Optical Character Recognition
- Read: Digital images of license plates and vehicles associated metadata (e.g., date, time and geographic coordinates associated with the vehicle image capture) that are captured by the ALPR system.
- Alert: A visual and/or auditory notice that is triggered when the ALPR system receives a potential "hit" on a license plate. This can be done through email and/or text messaging.
- Hit: A read matched to a plate that has previously been registered on an agency's "hot list" of vehicle plates related to stolen vehicles, wanted vehicles or other factors supporting investigation or which has been manually registered by a user for further investigation.
- Hot List: License plate numbers of stolen vehicles, vehicles owned by persons of interest and vehicles associated with AMBER Alerts that are regularly added to "hot lists" circulated among law enforcement agencies. Hot list information can come from a variety of sources, including stolen vehicle information from the National Insurance Crime Bureau and the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) as well as national AMBER Alerts and Department of Homeland Security watch lists. Departments of motor vehicles can provide lists of expires registration tags and law enforcement agencies can interface their own, locally compiles hot lists to the LPR system. These lists serve an officer safety function as well as an investigatory purpose. In addition to agency supported hot lists, users may also manually add license plate numbers to hot lists in order to be alerted if and when a vehicle license plate of interest is "read" by the LPR system. Such manual entries must be for law enforcement purpose and the purpose must be documented. These lists are maintained in a log book for future additions and deletions in the police station and are to be reviewed on a daily basis.
- Fixed LPR System: LPR camera systems of one or more fixed high-speed cameras combined with computer algorithms to convert images of registration plates into computer-readable data.
- Mobile LPR System: LPR cameras that are affixed, either permanently (hardwired) or temporarily (e.g. magnet-mounted) to a law enforcement vehicle for mobile deployment.
- Portable LPR System: LPR cameras that are transportable and can be moved and deployed in a variety of venues as needed such as a traffic barrel or speed radar sign.

### 4.0 PROCEDURES

### 4.1 General

- 4.1.1 Reasonable Suspicion or Probable Cause are not required before using the ALPR.
- 4.1.2 Misuse of this equipment and associated databases, or data, will be subject to disciplinary actions and/or possible criminal sanctions.
- 4.1.3 ALPR systems, ALPR data and associated media are the property of the Ambridge Police Department and intended for use in official law enforcement business.
- 4.1.4 All users of the ALPR system, by virtue of their use of the system, waive and right or expectation of privacy.
- 4.1.5 Members are prohibited from copying or using any ALPR data and associated media for personal use or posting and ALPR data, photograph, audio, video, text or any other multimedia file to any social networking platforms either on their own site, the sites of others known to them, the sites of others unknown to them, news media pages or other information exchange forums.
- 4.1.6 To ensure compliance with the requirements of this policy, audits of the ALPR data and dissemination of such data will be conducted biannually.

### 4.2 Administration

- 4.2.1 The ALPR technology, also known as License Plate Recognition (LPR), allows for the automated detection of license plates. This department uses it to convert data associated with vehicle license plates for official law enforcement purposes, including but not limited to: identifying stolen or wanted vehicles, stolen, suspended or expired license plates and missing persons. It may also be used to gather information related to active warrants, bond and PFA violations, Amber and Homeland Security alerts, narcotics investigations, suspect interdiction, stolen property recovery, routine patrol operations or other criminal investigations.
- 4.2.2 The Chief shall designate an employee(s) with administrative oversight to administer the day-to-day operation of the ALPR equipment and data.
- 4.2.3 Records will be maintained identifying approved LPR deployments and documenting their results, including appropriate documentation of significant incidents and arrests that are related to LPR usage.
- 4.2.4 While an APR may be used to canvass license plates around any crime scene, particular consideration should be given to using ALPR-equipped vehicles to canvass areas around homicides, shootings and other major incidents. Partial license plates reported during major crimes should be entered into the ALPR system in an attempt to identify suspect vehicles.
- 4.2.5 All installation and maintenance of ALPR equipment, as well as ALPR data retention and access, shall be managed by the Chief of Police (or designee) in cooperation with any server agency agreement (BCDA).
- 4.2.6 All personnel are to note in their ALERT report that an alert or hotlist has been created in that particular investigation.
- 4.2.7 Authorized officials entering alerts or hotlists for their respective agency are required to remove that alert or hotlist once the suspect has been arrested, vehicle recovered, missing person located or reason for the entry satisfied and document such in a supplemental ALERT report.

### 4.3 License Plate Reader System Usage

- 4.3.1 ALPR operation and access to ALPR collected data shall be for official law enforcement purposes only.
- 4.3.2 Only officers who have been properly trained in the use and operational protocols of the ALPR systems shall be permitted to use it.
- 4.3.3 The OIC of a shift is responsible to update the LPR system each and every day and communicate that action to his/her relief and make a notation in the logbook that it was completed.
- 4.3.4 ALPR Alerts/Hits: If practical and safe to do so, prior to the initiation of the stop:
  - Visually verify that the vehicle plate number matches the plate number run by the LPR system, including both alphanumeric characters of the plate and the state of issuance.
  - Verify the current status of the plate through dispatch or MDT query.
- 4.3.5 In each case in which an alert or hit is triggered, the user should document such in a supplemental report.
- 4.3.6 Hot lists may be updated manually if the user enters a specific plate into the ALPR system and wants to be alerted when that plate is located. Whenever a plate is manually entered into the ALPR system, the officer shall document the reason.

- 4.3.7 Special Details: ALPR use during nontraditional deployments (e.g., special operations) must be approved by the Chief or on-duty Sergeant/OIC.
- 4.3.8 Searched of historical data within the ALPR system may be done but must be documented and approved by the Chief or on-duty Sergeant/OIC.
- 4.3.9 The ALPR system may be used for alerting Law Enforcement to the potential access of vehicle locations that may be considered restricted due to a PFA or bond restriction that may be in place.
- 4.3.10 ALL ALPR data downloaded to the mobile workstation and in storage shall be accessible only through a login/password-protected system capable of documenting all access of information by name, date and time.

### 4.4 LPR Data Sharing and Dissemination

- 4.4.1 The ALPR is for official use only and may be shared only with other law enforcement or prosecutorial agencies for official law enforcement purposes or as otherwise permitted by Pennsylvania law, using the following procedures:
  - 4.4.1.1 A supervisor from the outside agency makes a written request for the ALPR data that includes:
    - The name of the agency,
    - The name and rank of the requesting person,
    - The intended purpose for obtaining the information.
  - 4.4.1.2 The request is reviewed and approved by the OIC on duty.
  - 4.4.1.3 All requests, approved or denied, are retained on file.

### 5.0 RETENTION

### 5.1 General

- 5.1.1 The Chief or designee is responsible for ensuring systems and processes are in place for the proper collection and retention of ALPR data. Data will be transferred and stored to the designated server.
- 5.1.2 All stored ALPR data should be retained in accordance with the established records retention schedule mandated by current Pennsylvania law. Thereafter, ALPR data should be purged unless it has become, or it is reasonable to believe it will become, evidence in a criminal or civil action or is subject to a discovery request or other lawful action to produce records. In those circumstances, the applicable data should be downloaded onto portable media and logged into evidence.
- 5.1.3 Data will be stored locally on the Beaver County District Attorney owned server or the Ambridge Police Department server.
- 5.1.4 Data stored plate images shall be stored for at least 90 (ninety) days.

### 6.0 TRAINING

### 6.1 General

- 6.1.1 No member of this department shall operate ALPR equipment or access ALPR data without first completing a training course approved by the Chief of Police.
- 6.1.2 Training of the LPR system will be provided as needed.
