



## AMBRIDGE BICENTENNIAL COOKBOOK RECIPE STORIES

*"An Historical Taste of Ambridge"*

In 1804, the follower of the Separatist George Rapp (1757-1847) emigrated to America from Lptingen (near Stuttgart) in the southwest Germany seeking religious and economic freedom. Nearly 800 farmers and craftsmen followed their leader to Butler County, Pennsylvania where they built the town of Harmony. Ten years later they migrated westward to Posey County, Indiana founding a second town named Harmony, which today is known as New Harmony. In 1824, the Harmony society returned to Pennsylvania, this time settling in Beaver County along the Ohio River. There they founded "Oekonomie," now better known as Old Economy Village. Leaders purchased 3,000 acres of land stretching from current day Leetsdale to Beaver Falls to Economy borough.
